

Welcome to Concurrent Enrollment!

Concurrent Enrollment is a Utah Valley University-High School partnership program. Qualified high school students can take college courses through Live Interactive courses taught by a UVU professor and broadcast at the high school. The Live Interactive classes are taught during specific times and then the student is asked to complete assignments on Canvas. There is sometimes little directions and assistance from the professor. You can always reach out to your professor through Canvas messages and email. Students are asked to follow along in class, take notes and collaborate with fellow students. Students are asked to be self-disciplined and self-guided to do well.

The following are requirements to participate in the Concurrent Enrollment program. Some classes require prerequisites to take including English, Math and Philosophy. Students must have an ACT score of at least 19+ for English and Reading or ACT score of 21+ in Math to take these classes. This means that these classes are for Juniors and Seniors.

A successful candidate will meet the following indicators for success:

STUDENT

- Shows strong study skills in time management, preparing for and taking exams, using information resources, taking class notes, and allocating sufficient time to complete tasks well.
- Uses critical thinking skills such as inquisitiveness, analysis, interpretation, problem solving, reasoning, and precision and accuracy.
- Monitors, evaluates, and directs own learning and takes personal responsibility for success in school.
- 3.0 GPA for Academic classes (English, Math, Science) and 2.0 GPA for CTE classes (Art, Nutrition)
- Live Interactive classes are taught during specific times that the student is required to be in to learn the class material.

PARENT/GUARDIAN

- Supports the student's participation in the Concurrent Enrollment program.
- Believes the student is capable of understanding college-level material and rigor.

SCHOOL COUNSELOR

Recommends the student for Concurrent Enrollment and confirms that the student has good attendance, behaves
well in the classroom, and is capable of understanding college-level material, producing quality assignments, and
performing well on exams.

FACILITATOR/ TEACHER

• There is a teacher/ facilitator in the high school classroom to oversee the classes. They are there to help students with any questions but your best option is to ask the professor during class or by email to answer specific questions about your individual class.


ACT

Includes four multiple-choice tests: English, Math, Reading, and Science. Please see your school counselor for details.

PLACEMENT EXAM REQUIREMENT

A placement exam is required for all students wanting to participate in the English, Math and Philosophy classes. These tests need to be scheduled and taken at UVU through their testing center. The following are options to meet this requirement.

If needed, inquire at check-in for a parking permit. Permits are required for all UVU parking lots.

Testing Center Location, The Testing Center is located on the northwest rim of UVU's main campus and is housed in a series of trailers labeled the Wolverine Service Center (WS). The address is: 1165 West 800 South Orem, UT 84058 Enter through the north entrance of the building and go through the first door to your right to Room 112.

Admission to UVU and receiving your UVID number is required prior to taking this exam. The Accuplacer and ALEKS Math test are offered at the UVU Testing Center.

The Accuplacer exam consists of three sections: Reading Comprehension and Sentence Skills. ALEKS Math test is only for Math placement. **Testers must take the entire Accuplacer exam.**
